

Arrow's 12 coexistence commitments

Arrow considers coexistence to mean allowing Australia to enjoy the full benefits from both agricultural and resource industries.






For our part, we will ensure:

- minimised overlap on intensively farmed land
- no permanent damage to productivity of either the land or the Great Artesian Basin
- landholders are fairly compensated for possible impacts from our activities.

We will demonstrate coexistence, in collaboration with our landholders, in three ways:

1. pre-development design work to minimise our footprint
2. best practice construction management to minimise our impact on soil during the drilling phase
3. best practice operational management to minimise our impact on farm productivity.

12 Land Access Rules

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|  01 Only enter a property with the approval of your supervisor who has cleared access with the Access Department. |  07 Do not interfere with the landholder's property, equipment or operations. Use approved tracks and laydown areas. Drive at less than 10kph within 200m of buildings. Leave gates as signed or found. |
|  02 Only conduct activities that are approved within the access conditions. |  08 Do not take firearms, weapons, animals, illicit drugs or alcohol onto the property. |
|  03 Follow directions of landholders. Report any directions that are not within the access conditions. |  09 Do not light fires unless authorised. Smoking is only permitted in the designated locations. |
|  04 Report landholder discussions, complaints or incidents to your supervisor or Land Liaison Officer. |  10 Do not enter a site during or after wet weather without consent of the Land Liaison Officer (who has cleared access with the landholder) except in the case of a declared emergency. |
|  05 Carry personal and vehicle identification showing that you are an employee or contractor of Arrow. |  11 Only authorised staff are permitted to discuss activities and access conditions with the landholder. |
|  06 Keep sites tidy, ensure all rubbish is removed from site. |  12 Do not threaten or pressure landholders or other people on the property. |

Arrow has made 12 commitments to coexistence on intensively farmed land (IFL) in the Surat Basin:

1. No permanent alienation
2. Minimised operational footprint – less than 2% of total IFL area
3. Flexibility on CSG well locations, but all wells located by edge of farm paddocks
4. Pad drilling (up to 8 wells from a single pad) used where coal depth and geology allows
5. Spacing between wells maximised (average of between 800m – 1500m)
6. Pitless drilling only
7. No major infrastructure facilities on IFL (dams, compression stations, gas gathering stations, water treatment)
8. Treated CSG water used to substitute existing users' allocations on IFL
9. No brine/salt treatment or disposal on IFL
10. Flexibility on power supply option
11. Fair compensation
12. Continued proactive engagements with community and transparency on coexistence field activities.

*Commitment 8 refers to the area of greatest predicted drawdown on the Condamine Alluvium resulting from CSG extraction by Arrow Energy.

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
